ARE YOU STILL PRAYING "THY KINGDOM COME"?

I am!

In that prayer Jesus taught us to pray two thousand years ago, He told us to pray "thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven"...

Some have narrowly seen this instruction as to apply only to the ESTABLISHMENT of the kingdom (since the kingdom has already been here for many years, we do not need to pray for it).

Sometimes God's "kingdom" refers to His "realm of rule", or His exercise of His reign. While God IS always in control, no one would say that His authority has been respected or submitted to worldwide. And even though His "kingdom of Christ" has been established its potential is for endless expansion, as another soul submits to it – so it is continually "coming" in that sense. But, Christ Himself clarifies the point: "Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven." That does not mean that everyone will submit to it, but that His purpose and will for all – whether submissive or not – will finally be imposed. He speaks of such a time in Php. 2:10 "That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; 11 And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." As far as we are concerned, ready or not, when He is ready, He WILL have His way!

That will be a "great and terrible" day! For some it will be a goal reached to finally be taken to be with Jesus – GREAT! To most, it will be the bitter harvest of a life which would not yield to the authority of God – TERRIBLE! The ending is entirely up to us.
